# Parish Council

#### **Parish Council News**

Apparently, there are around 70 household in our parish with dogs - not surprising, given the lovely walking countryside that surrounds us. However, there are occasional difficulties associated with walking dogs on parish paths across farmland. There is a useful guide for dog owners and walkers at <a href="http://www.somerset.gov.uk/policies-and-plans/plans/rights-of-way/">http://www.somerset.gov.uk/policies-and-plans/rights-of-way/</a>. Here are some of the points in it:

- The Countryside Code highlights that your dog should be kept under close control. There's no definition
  what close control actually means, but it's good practice to ensure your dog is trained to respond to your
  commands and walks close with you. If your dog wanders off out of sight and doesn't come back when
  called, then it should be walked on a lead.
- Always bear in mind that it is an offence to allow your dog to worry or attack livestock and remember, as a
  last resort, a farmer is legally entitled to shoot a dog if they can't stop it chasing or worrying their farm
  animals. If you meet farm animals while out walking it's probably best to put your dog on a lead and leave as
  much space between your dog and the animals as possible.
- Farmers and landowners also have a responsibility to ensure their working dogs and pets are well
  controlled. Aggressive, protective or loose dogs can be very intimidating. Landowners should do everything
  they can to make sure their dogs are kept under close control at all times you can never tell when someone
  might be using a public right of way crossing over land or through a farm.

Looking ahead, there are a few more road closures coming-up for Gigaclear cabling work on Moortown Lane and Islemoor Road in February and March – watch-out for diversions. A County-Wide Parking Review is ongoing and Traffic Engineers will no longer deal with individual and very local traffic engineering requests that benefit a small number of individuals. But we were pleased to note that new signage directing HGVs has already been approved and should be established before Apr 19.

The Precept for next year has been agreed as an increase of 2% (equivalent to a £1.11 a year increase on a Band D charge). The Precept and Reserves (plus grant funding wherever possible) will fund costs such as supporting the Village Hall and Playing Fields; maintenance spend to safeguard existing Parish assets (eg cemetery, churchyard and walls); and meeting new requirements.

There are new requirements to make sure our village website can be used by as many people as possible on laptops and mobile devices. In the UK, 1 in 5 people have a disability (eg impaired vision, motor difficulties, deafness or impaired hearing) so we need to ensure that our content and design are clear and simple enough so that most people can use it without needing to adapt it, while supporting those who do. Please contact the Clerk or the Webmaster if you are experiencing any difficulties using the website or if you have any technical expertise in website design that may be useful.

Our long-standing Webmaster, Andrew Barrett, has expressed a wish to hand-over his duties in the medium-term. Ideally, someone in the village with appropriate skills would take on this role to support the local community. If anyone is interested and would like to know more about the role, please contact the Webmaster at webmaster@fivehead-village.org.uk or 01460 281520.

Your Parish Councillors' term of office comes to an end in May after 4 years of service and there will be an election on 02 May 2019. There are seven seats on the Council – perhaps you would like to stand for election? As a local councillor, you can become a voice for your community and drive forward real change. To stand for election to a local council you must:

- Be a UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be an elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.

#### Did You Know?

Cardboard recycling - As there is limited capacity, waste vehicles can only accept the equivalent of two recycling boxes worth of cardboard when flattened. The service is not designed for the bulk recycling of large boxes or sheets of cardboard from white goods, new kitchens or multiple on-line purchases. If you have generated a lot of cardboard, please either cut it up and put into your boxes over several weeks or take to a recycling site and use the larger capacity recycling skips.

Advice from Trading Standards www.devonsomersettradingstandards.gov.uk/ on avoiding scams:

Renewable energy scams - Research the market. Don't be tempted by a seemingly unbeatable deal from a doorstep trader, mailshot or cold phone call. Never be rushed or intimidated into making a decision. If you receive a cold phone call tempting you to invest in renewable energy, don't give any personal or financial information. If you want to switch energy supplier, use the Citizens Advice comparison tool at energycompare.citizensadvice.org.uk. Before signing anything, read the terms and conditions and make sure you know what you are signing up to. Ask a trusted friend for help.

**Computer support scams -** Delete suspicious emails without opening any attachments or replying to them. Hang up immediately on cold callers who claim there is a problem with your computer or ask you for personal or financial information. If you are worried there may be a problem with your computer, you could contact a genuine company using the phone number on their paperwork or website, or ask for help at the shop where you bought it.

Use the Buy with Confidence scheme where businesses are vetted, approved and monitored by Trading Standards. Search at <a href="buywithconfidence.gov.uk">buywithconfidence.gov.uk</a> or call 01392 383430. If you are worried you have been scammed: get advice from Citizens Advice on 03454 040 506 and report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.

# Fivehead Remembers



#### **Fivehead Hero's Medals Restored**

Thanks to the generosity of our Village through crowdfunding, we've been able to recover (Albert) George Chorley's WWI medals and have them restored and mounted. He was the last of 12 men from our Villages to be killed in the War, this is his story...

#### Lance Bombardier George Chorley.

### 8th Division Ammunition Column, Royal Field Artillery

George was just 2 months old when his mother, Ruth died leaving his father, James to look after their eight children, all under the age of 10. George was raised by his Grandmother, Phyllis Marsh of Angel Row, Fivehead and his siblings remained with their father in Fivehead who remarried and moved to Curry Rivel a few years later.


George became a baker (working for Mr Hillard at what is now The Old Bakery) and was a prominent member of the Baptist Chapel in the Village. He remained in Fivehead until he enlisted at Bristol and joined the Royal Field Artillery, he would have been 35 at the start of the War in 1914.

It's likely that George would have seen service throughout the War; the 8th Divisional Ammunition Column, RFA served with 8th Division; it was formed at Hursley Park, Winchester during October 1914 from regular army units

returning from around the British Empire therefore it's possible that George fought in the Boer War, but no records have been found.

We know George was serving in September 1917 as it was reported in the Langport and Somerton Herald that he had been home on leave for ten days and his friends were pleased to see him 'looking so well'.

The 8th Division proceeded to France in November 1914, a muchneeded reinforcement to the BEF and remained on the Western Front throughout the War. In 1915 they were in action at The Battle



At the end of April 1918, five divisions of Commonwealth forces (IX Corps) were posted to the French 6th Army near the River Aisne to rest and refit following the German offensives on the Somme and Lys. Here, at the end of May, they found themselves facing the overwhelming German attack which, despite fierce opposition, pushed the

Allies back across the Aisne to the Marne. They suffered 15,000 fatal casualties.

On 26th May 1918, George's unit were ordered to position their heavy guns around the River Aisne area near Reims in Northern France. It was reported that George died of wounds, but he has no known grave and is commemorated on the Commonwealth War Graves Memorial at Soissons on the banks of the Aisne. George was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. His family would have received the Memorial Plaque, or 'Dead Man's Penny' as did all those who lost someone during the War. The medals will be on display shortly.



# The door-opening God.

February 2019

In some situations, it is sadly still the case that 'it's not what you know, but who you know' that counts. How often have we heard that expression? We hope that times have changed and that nepotism is increasingly a thing of the past, but in some areas of life it is still the case that an old school tie, or friends in high places, can mean more than hard-earned qualifications or experience. To put it simply, knowing the right people can open doors.

Clearly this sort of favouritism is unfair and frankly immoral; something we may rightly deplore. But surprisingly there is a way in which the phrase above describes rather well the essence of being a Christian. You see, at its heart, the Christian faith is also **not** about **what** you know, but **who** you know. People do not become Christians by knowing or doing certain things, but by a personal encounter with Jesus, the Son of God. Being a Christian is very much about who you know.

This analogy of 'doors opening' can be expanded further. In the New Testament (1 Corinthians 16: 8/9) the Apostle Paul writes: 'But I will stay in Ephesus until Pentecost, for a wide door for effective work has been opened for me...' These verses show us that whereas being a Christian does not usually open doors to power, fame or fortune, it does open other sorts of doors. The doors Jesus opens bring us new opportunities in his service and new experiences of his grace. It offers new possibilities and direction to life that we may have never thought possible. What we may have previously considered beyond us, Christ can equip us to face with courage.

Being a Christian is not just about arriving at a safe destination (although the assurance of eternal life in heaven is a key element of Christian hope) it is also about discovering doors into uncharted territory. We cannot open these doors on our own, but wonderfully we don't have to, because for the Christian, more than anyone else, it's not what we know, but who we know.

In the late spring/early summer this year, our Benefice church families will be offering to everyone the opportunity to better know the 'door-opening God', through a series of gatherings called *Alpha*. Venue, dates and times to follow. If you would value the opportunity to refresh your faith and understanding, or suspect that what you've heard from others about Christianity is unfair or wrong, or if you would simply like the chance to make sure the decision you've made about Christ and Christianity has been an informed one, then please do consider coming along. The doors will be open...

### **Letter from The Manse**

A Church is not a building, but a Community of people – people of faith who are seeking to follow Jesus. When Jesus began his ministry at the age of 30, the first thing he did was to gather around him a community of disciples who learned from him, followed him and joined in with his work.

Fivehead Baptist Church is a community gathered from this and other villages who meet regularly to worship, but also to serve the community of Fivehead and area. That's why, some six and a half years ago, we opened **The Stable Community Coffee Shop**, serving high quality coffee, tea and cakes, and providing a hub for people to meet. The café is deliberately named a "Community" Coffee Shop as it is run by volunteers from the local community, for the community – locals and visitors. The profits are used only to sustain the work and any surplus is donated to local and international causes. Last year we donated £1000 to the village, which is being used to install exercise equipment in the playing field and a new bench by the War Memorial.

Every month we have a different display of artwork by local artists, but in March the café and the church hall will host an extended **Exhibition of Wildlife Photography**. I shall have some of my photos on display, along with Carl Bovis and a number of other photographers from the Somerset Levels who post their pictures in the Somerset Nature Photography Facebook group. This is timed to coincide with the beginning of the Heron nesting season at RSPB Swell Wood.

# Gardening Club

# Gardening in January & February: Absolutely everything you need to do

It might be cold, but the garden is starting to come alive, so get digging, feeding, mulching and pruning in preparation for the year ahead.

#### **Shrubs**

It's time to prune deciduous shrubs and fruit trees, before the sap starts to rise and the buds break. Cut out anything that's dead, diseased or damaged. Also look at the shape of trees and shrubs – rounded is usually best, with no crossing branches. However, if you're dealing with a large tree it's probably better to leave it to a tree surgeon.

#### **Perennials**

If you want to grow something a bit different, think about planting seeds, as it gives you an enormous range of options.

#### Fruit and vegetables

Digging is the thing to do now. Leave the soil in rough chunks and it will be broken down by the weather in time for sowing.

Potatoes, onion sets and shallots can be planted in a few weeks so it's a good idea to order them now.

Cut back autumn-fruiting raspberries. These flower and fruit on this year's growth, so if you cut back the old stems, you'll encourage new growth and get a better crop.

If you have room under cover, you can sow tender vegetables such as tomatoes, chillies, peppers and cucumbers.

You can also start on some of the hardier vegetables that just need a bit of protection, such as broad beans, beetroot, carrots and early peas.

#### Hedges

This is a good month to plant hedges. It's worth looking out for bare-root plants as they're cheaper than potgrown ones. They're dug up from the field and posted directly to you, so they miss out on all the costs of watering and re-potting that bump up the price of container-grown plants. The availability of bare-root plants depends on the weather, but they should be around until the end of February and into March.

#### **Roses**

If you didn't do it in autumn, this is the time to prune roses and other summer-flowering shrubs such as late clematis and buddleias. This pruning is for flowers and there's a simple way to approach it; every time you make a cut, and always cut just above a bud, imagine a new stem coming from that bud with a season's growth with a flower on the end of it.

# Olly's Parmesan & Poppy Seed Biscuits

### **Ingredients**

185 G Plain Flour

1 tsp Salt

1 tsp Wholegrain Mustard

1 tsp Cumin

150 g Unsalted Butter

75 g Finely Grated Cheddar Cheese

75 g Finely Grated Parmesan Cheese

Sesame Seeds & Poppy Seeds mixed together to coat

### Method

- 1. Tip the flour, salt, mustard & cumin into a food processor
- 2. Add the butter and blend until breadcrumb consistency
- 3. Add the cheese until it forms a dough and add a little water
- 4. Roll into a log about 7cm thick and roll in the mix of seeds then refrigerate until required
- 5. When needed slice thinly and cook for 12 mins at 160° C, nicest served warm (not hot too crumbly)
