## **Parish Council News**

With a wet June and a hot (so far) July, combined with all the news about the environment, there have been



quite a few 'grass-related' issues to consider. The District Council (SSDC) team do a good job mowing our grassy areas with a fortnightly cut in the Summer. This year they had a challenging time avoiding the many pyramidal orchids flowering everywhere. The rear half of the cemetery had a splendid display of wild flowers. This area gets mown in mid-late July in line with the historical mowing pattern that maximises seeding whilst keeping the area tidy. We have also been in contact with Somerset Wildlife Trust about their Fivehead Arable Fields Nature Reserve management plan. They have kindly offered a guided weekday walk in June 2020.

Somerset County Council (SCC) is responsible for the verges and footpaths. Feedback has been given to them about the state of some roadside verges where a combination of only one cut and the wet weather meant that the cut was not clean with debris left in

situ. The poor visibility at the top of Ganges Hill because of the vegetation on the roadside has been reported and is being kept under review. The excellent footpath website <a href="https://roam.somerset.gov.uk/roam/Dashboard/Welcome">https://roam.somerset.gov.uk/roam/Dashboard/Welcome</a> has been used by several parishioners to report overgrown footpaths in Higher Swell and on the Isla Abbots Drove — we hope that this will result in some

Our thanks go to: Greenshutters Garden Centre for donating trees and plants for Langford Corner, to SSDC for offering to mow the grass there at no extra cost this year and to Mr & Mrs Hanney for mowing the grass there at short notice; to the various volunteers who have cleared the area by the telephone box; to the Stable café for the WW1 Memorial Seat on the Village Green and to Ken Male for installing it; and to the Kier Conservation Team and local volunteers who have restored the St Catherine's Well and surrounds.

SSDC are currently developing an Environment Strategy and we will be

discussing what initiatives might promote sustainable living in our village. All your ideas are welcomed.

SSDC are also consulting on a review of the South Somerset Local Plan <a href="https://www.southsomerset.gov.uk/your-council-plan-and-strategies/planning-policy/local-plan-review-2016-2036/">https://www.southsomerset.gov.uk/your-council-plan-and-strategies/planning-policy/local-plan-review-2016-2036/</a>. This includes the proposed strategy for new homes and employment between 2016-36, including site allocations and policies against which planning applications are assessed. The consultation will be discussed at the August and September meetings of the Parish Council – please let us know what you think.

We also need to hear what you think about this: parishioners in Swell tell us that road signage needs to be improved as delivery drivers get confused. SCC could install signs at a cost of c£300 per location. Please let the Clerk know whether or not you support the installation of two signs at a cost of c£600 from the Parish budget.

We have been made aware that a planning application for up to 17 houses between Butchers Hill and Ganges Hill may be submitted. If this occurs, a separate Planning meeting will be organised and advertised to meet the anticipated public interest.

## Did you know?

Recycle boxes outside on collection day are a vital part of Somerset's waste success story. Somerset's recycling rate is significantly above South-West and England averages, and it has been independently ranked as a carbon reduction high-flyer annually since 2012. Annual waste figures for 2018-19 show that Somerset's recycling and reuse is up 0.13% to 52.41% and more than 90% of that is being recycled in the UK. More kerbside collections of extra weekly recycling and three-weekly rubbish collections will start rolling out from mid-2020.

Sunny weather with al fresco meals can bring the risk of fires in refuse bins, collection trucks and at landfill sites from portable barbeque trays or coals. Please do not add embers, ash or charcoal from domestic or garden fires or barbeques to your rubbish bin or black sacks.

**Big and bulky?** Collections of furniture, white goods and other large or bulky items costs £44.50 for up to three items, plus £12.30 per item for up to two further items. Each item must be able to be carried by no more than two collectors. This service avoids using man-and-van operators whose suspiciously cheap deals risk your possessions being fly-tipped and could put you in court for failing to properly look after your waste. Advice from the Royal Mail and Trading Standards www.devonsomersettradingstandards.gov.uk/:

Beware of rogue traders selling mattresses and garden furniture from the back of vans. These items may be unsafe and fail to comply with flammability regulations or might already be worn out, stolen or overpriced. The goods may be wrapped so you don't know what you're buying. The traders may also not provide the correct paperwork and 14-day cooling-off period, and may give bogus details so they can't be traced. If you are approached at home or out and about and offered goods from the back of a van, don't buy anything. If you do want to buy the types of items being offered, get them from a reputable business that provides paperwork including a legitimate address. You can ask friends and family to recommend good businesses. Alternatively, you can find local, trustworthy businesses through the Buy With Confidence scheme.

**Beware of rogue roofers** A favourite tactic of rogue traders is to target the houses of vulnerable people, making up problems about their roof or chimney. They may deliberately cause damage then offer to fix it – for a fee. They may convince the resident to let them inspect the problem and claim it is serious and urgent. If the resident believes them and hires them to do the work, the rogue traders may overcharge for a poor-quality or incomplete job, or take the money up front and vanish without doing any work.

Not all traders who cold-call are rogue traders, but it's important to remember the golden rules:

Never agree to work from someone you think might be a rogue trader.

If you're not sure, don't open the door.

If an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is.

Use your door chain when opening the door to strangers.

Properly check the identity of callers before opening the door.

Keep doors and windows secure.

If you think a crime is being committed now or you are in danger, call the Police on 999 immediately. For non-emergencies, call the Police on 101.

Here's what the apostle Paul writes in one of his letters (1 Timothy chapter 2 vs. 1&2) 'I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people – for kings and all those in authority...' Pray for those in authority, says Paul, and in today's world that means to pray for those in positions of local, national and international government. But does praying for these people really change anything? Many today have decided that it doesn't, and that the only effective way to ensure our politicians take notice of anything is to take 'direct action'. And I can understand why this might seem like the only route. Over the years some politicians do seem to have had their own agendas, and a preparedness to put personal or party interests before the good of the nation.

I think it's worth pausing, however, to consider the 'lose, lose' world in which our politicians live and work. Whatever decision they take, however laudable, will *always* face opposition. They may make a stand on a moral issue such as supporting developing nations through aid; they may push for an alternative economic system designed to be fairer; they may support forward-looking policies such as better funding for our schools and a health care system that values the care of the elderly enough to fund it properly. We may even agree with all they say, but will we still do so when those policies have a direct impact on us? How will we respond when they cost us, perhaps affecting our job, where we can live, or our own health care? When difficult decisions need to be made they simply cannot please all the people all the time, and in a culture where vicious, personal attack on those we disagree with is tragically becoming more prevalent, this is a tough place to be.

The world around us is a complex place. Few subjects can be dealt with in isolation, and decisions made often have far-reaching effects. In the end it's not us, but those who make them, who will be held to account. So for everyone reading this who ever prays, can I encourage you to pray for our leaders? As God puts it in Proverbs chapter 8: 'I have good advice and sound wisdom; I have insight, I have strength. It is at my discretion that kings reign, rulers make just decrees and leaders govern wisely'.

In their 'lose, lose' position the Jeremys and Borises of this world, need all the help they can get. Now, and in the future, will you pray for them, asking that amongst the avalanche of human advice, they might also know within them God's good wisdom, insight and strength to govern wisely? There may be no greater need at this point in world history. With summer blessings of peace and hope in Christ (whoever our new PM is).

## **Letter from The Manse**

"Charity begins at home" – or so the popular saying goes.

There is certainly some truth in that: The apostle James writes, 'Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and food. If you say to them "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his needs, what good is it?' Jesus also said, "Love your neighbour as yourself". Often, our 'neighbour' may be someone very close to home - in our family or community – who has needs we can supply.

However, charity should not *end* at home. There is a vast world of need out there and we should not ignore our 'neighbours' who are brothers and sisters who live overseas. Indeed, their needs are often far greater than ours. To put it in perspective, for example, one school in Kenya, which Karen and I have visited several times has a pumped well which has recently run dry, so they now have to bring water 3km using wheelbarrows to supply the 200 children!

Karen and I will be travelling to Kenya in September, leading a small group from the Baptist Church who will be visiting IcFEM (Inter-Christian Fellowships' Evangelical Mission) <a href="www.icfem-mission.org">www.icfem-mission.org</a>. IcFEM is an indigenous Kenyan organisation in a town called Kimilili in the Western highlands of Kenya which brings together Christians from many different churches in each local area to bring about community transformation. This is achieved through education, medical care, agricultural development, and

care of the vulnerable – all of which flow from the Good News of Jesus. I am a trustee of IcFEM Europe which helps raise funds to support the work done by Kenyans, and Karen runs the School Sponsorship programme as well as supporting a group of disabled ladies who have formed a knitting co-operative. The mission statement of IcFEM is "Holy Living & Hard Work".

Charity is not about giving hand-outs to people, but rather giving people a hand-up to help themselves transform their own lives and those of their communities. We should never do something for someone if they can and should do it for themselves – this is disempowerment. Rather, if we can equip and empower people to improve their own lives, then whole communities can be transformed.

# Langport & District Red Cross Centre 40<sup>th</sup> Birthday

On 21<sup>st</sup> June 2019 thirty-two volunteers celebrated with a party and a trip down memory lane the forty years of volunteer-led use of Langport Red Cross Centre, the modest building that is the hub around which revolves their many activities. The members volunteering in 2019 have a total of 514 years of active service, and at the party Chris Davies, Somerset President, awarded three long-service awards to Sally Tomsett (our oldest active volunteer at 85) for ten years' service, Sandra Stannard also for ten years and Jill Lock, our secretary, for 25 years.

In 1978 the builder who built as his store what is now our Centre retired and having no further use for the building offered it to the Langport Division of the Red Cross for £6000. Plans were drawn up to convert it into a Centre for Medical Loan and training at a cost of a further £2000. The local Health Authority contributed £2600 and Somerset HQ arranged a loan which was paid back by the fund-raising efforts of the volunteers of the time over the next five years. So on 21<sup>st</sup> June 1979 Lady Luttrell opened the Centre which has been in active use ever since. It has an excellent site on the side of Langport's main car park in the centre of the small town.



Now designated a Fund Raising Centre it is open to the public six mornings a week providing a lifeline to many



lonely elderly people from Langport and its surrounding villages, as evidenced by our Appreciation Book. We provide companionship, refreshments for a donation, and sell donated goods, raising £10,179 in 2018. The fifteen volunteers who work at the Centre are supplemented by another twenty who help with collections at shops and Red Cross Week. With the profits from Theatre Trips to Bristol organised by the Group Leader our total turnover to support the British Red Cross in 2018 was £21,029. Since we started opening daily in 2001, we have recorded a turnover of £313, 000. We also have a team of six fully qualified first aiders who support events over a wide area.

Although unusual as a volunteer led centre in the 2019 British Red Cross, we justify our continued existence on financial grounds, let alone considering all the good we do for the local community which has been recognised by the Group Leader receiving Community Service awards from Somerset County Council, Langport Town Council, and Somerton Town Council.

Altogether we are a great success story, thanks to a happy band of dedicated volunteers and many very appreciative customers and patrons.

## **Scallops with Saffron Sauce**

## **Ingredients**

8 Scallops

45g (1.1/2 Oz) Butter

1 Small onion, finely chopped

2 Tbsps Dry Vermouth

125ml (4 fl. oz) Dry White Wine

2 Tomatoes Skinned, seeded and finely chopped

1/4 Tsp powdered Saffron

125g (4 oz) Fine asparagus tips

3 Tbsps Crème Fraiche

Salt & pepper to taste

## **Method**

- 1. In a frying pan melt half the butter and quickly fry the scallops for 2-3 minutes turning until they are opaque. Remove from the pan with any juices and keep warm
- 2. In the same pan, melt the remaining butter add the onions and gently fry for 5 minutes until softened (do not brown). Add the vermouth, wine tomatoes and saffron, bring to the boil, then simmer until the liquid has reduced by half.
- 3. Meanwhile lightly steam the asparagus tips for 3-4 minutes, add to the pan with the scallops, crème fraiche, salt and pepper. Simmer for 2 minutes, check seasoning and serve.
- 4. Serve with new potatoes, pasta or rice
