The Parish Council held its first face-to-face meeting for 14 months at the Playing Field on 8 June. Throughout the Summer, the Council plans to hold meetings outdoors (weather permitting) or socially distanced at the Village Hall.

As case levels continue to rise, due to the infectiousness of the latest variants and the lifting of the majority of legal restrictions, many people and organisations are still continuing with safety measures for a while longer (face masks, hand sanitiser, plastic shields and distancing), to help protect us all, especially our front-line workers and vulnerable residents; you are urged to be cautious, think of others, and do anything you feel appropriate to continue to help keep our Parish safe.

It is still a worrying time for some, but we can be reassured by the numbers of severe illness and hospitalisation being greatly reduced, through having a large part of the population now fully vaccinated. Being sensible about how far we go in the next couple of months, will help keep things under control until the rest of the population have been double-jabbed, especially those in the younger age brackets. The message from Somerset County health leaders is please **“think twice, do the right thing, and don’t let your guard down”**.

Our community thrives on the support and goodwill of parish volunteers. A new **‘Village Volunteers’** page was added to our website in June for local groups to promote volunteer vacancies. These are also advertised through our social media channels.

The Parish Council has been delighted to welcome Mary Braddock, who moved to Fivehead late last year, and has recently taken over the role of Parish Paths Liaison Officer. The Council would also like to thank Jacquie Mahoney and Margaret Knox, who have done a tremendous amount of work to keep our footpaths tidy and accessible over the years. It’s very much a team effort, with support from Somerset County Council with training and resources.

In August, the Council is looking forward to hearing more from Dave Braddock, who has offered to help our community with environmental projects going forward. Dave has already undertaken some important wildlife studies over the last couple of months, which have brought to light the amazing number of different species of bats and moths at Fivehead, including Greater Horseshoe bats and Jersey Mocha moths (*Cyclophora ruficiliaria*), which are incredibly rare in the UK.

Another team of volunteers has been behind the restoration of Fivehead’s phone kiosk and opening of a new **‘Book Exchange’** (see opposite). Thanks to Julian Cramp, the shelving is looking great. Helen Hanney and Caroline Lumley-Frank are popping by daily to ensure the shelves aren’t overflowing with kind donations. Outside is looking just as lovely, thanks to flowers from Caroline and the general tidy up around the relocated waste bin by Jon Rose, who is responsible for the overall refurbishment of the decommissioned BT box. This has involved hours of cleaning, repairing and coats of paint inside and out. Thanks to Jon, Julian, Helen and Caroline - it looks fantastic!

The Council is now looking for volunteers to help with purchasing and operating (with training) a defibrillator for the village, to be housed alongside the books. If you would like to help, please contact the Parish Clerk.

After many months of restrictions on Somerset life, we hope that, this summer, you can all finally enjoy doing at least some of the things you have missed.

Reconnecting with Parish life...



To ensure community life does eventually get back to normal and thrive again, groups, organisations and events need the support of new members and volunteers.

We are lucky that our Parish has lots of willing and skilled people. We have a lovely café at The Stable, run by the Baptist Church and volunteers, and our Parish Support Network has been there for those in need throughout the pandemic. Our Village Hall and Playing Field Committees, now back up and running, are also run by volunteers.

Our recent Housing Needs Assessment (HNA) was conducted on behalf of the Parish Council, by yet another volunteer - Mary Cramp, a qualified and experienced medical researcher. A copy of the study has been circulated with this issue and we hope you will take the opportunity to read the findings, especially if you are thinking about building work on your land or property in future. The assessment has now been issued to SSDC planning, our Ward Member and County Councillor, to support decision making on future planning applications. The Parish Council is very grateful for Mary's support with this.

All developers are also encouraged to read the pre-application engagement advice which can be found on the Parish website (under the Planning tab), as well as obtaining information and support available via the South Somerset District Council website.

Do you have the time/skills to lead our Parish defibrillator project?

Would you like to train to use it and possibly help save a life?

As part of the response to our HNA survey, many of you voted to have a defibrillator available in the village. The shelving in our phone kiosk has been planned with this in mind. It is hoped that, with the help of volunteers to run this project, the Parish might be able to obtain funding to purchase the equipment, and also deliver training to volunteers who would be willing to operate it. The village has a predominantly older population, so it is hoped that this will be a useful thing to have, even if it is rarely ever needed. Please contact the Clerk if you can help with this.



New takeaway facility - Book Exchange opens in Fivehead

The old phone kiosk, now owned by the Parish Council, has been transformed into a Book Exchange for the village.

This new community asset means that you can take away books to read at home and also deliver books for others to enjoy. Already the shelves are full with a range of hardback and paperback books. There are fiction and non-fiction books, a children's shelf and also books for young adults – something for everyone, young and old!

The Exchange is maintained by volunteers who keep it tidy.

Fivehead History

From the jottings of Ella Louch

Club Day (Last Thursday in May)

At about 10 o'clock on Club Morning members would be arriving looking very smart in their Sunday Best clothes and carrying their club poles. A procession would form, and after a snack of bread & cheese, would march behind a band followed by many women & children. The route was usually up **Butchers Hill**, around the top and down **Ganges Hill**, calling at **Manor Farm** before continuing on its journey to be at **St Martin's Church** for a service at 11 o'clock.

Of course this would mean passing the **Crown Inn** and several stewards were appointed to keep order and see that nobody took a wrong turning into the pub and so miss the church service. Anyone making this sad mistake would have a fine imposed, and in my time I saw many near misses.

At the service the first hymn would always be "**All people that on earth do dwell**" and the sermon always contained the little mention of the number who had not been seen in church since the last Club Day, followed by numerous coughs and shuffling of feet.

There was much about Club Day that always stayed in my memory, almost all cottage gardens had their Lilac trees and the scent of Lilac seemed everywhere, so very lovely in the warm spring air. Another thing was the delicious **Ginger Bread**, made & sold by one of the **Miss Townsends** on one of the many stalls in the club field. I always tried to keep some for the following day, when it would have grown soft, but alas, lack of will power often prevailed.

I must also mention the **Club Banner** which was carried by **Mr. William Priddle** and later by his son **Joe**. It was a beautiful blue and had lots of tassels and had the inscription **Bear one another's burdens**. On windy days this banner was quite difficult to carry as it was very heavy & owing to its age was often torn and so was continually mended by **Mrs. Grace Gridley**, mother of the Club secretary.

Sadly there came a day when mending was no longer possible and it was taken to **The Taunton Museum**. Another banner was purchased, but not really liked by many people, but costs were high and an expensive one was not affordable. This banner was eventually placed in **St Martin's Church**. (After restoration it is now in the committee room of the **Village Hall**, along with one of the main poles)

To continue with the Club Day Programme, after the Church Service the procession continued to the Club Field where a huge marquee had been erected, there all the members sat down to lunch. In the early years a cooked meal was provided by **Mr. Alfred Dinham** of **Tanyard Farm** and transported down by horse drawn carriage. In later years a cold lunch was provided.

The President sat at the top table on his decorated chair with other local dignitaries. Cider was a very popular drink in those days (and still is) and barrels would arrive the previous evening and be tapped in readiness. Two members, always non drinkers or moderate were chosen to dole out each man with his ration, but as most farms had their own Cider Press and were visited on the club walk 90% of the members had drunk more than was wise.

Speeches continued until about 3 o'clock when the procession would form up again behind the band and march to **Langford Manor** where the President's mother & family were entertained by the band. After this the Club dispersed and the members joined their families for tea at **The Lambert Hut** or their homes before returning to the Fairground for the evening entertainment.

Save Our Crown Update

Save Our Crown – July update

As many of you will have already heard, we have good news on two counts.

Firstly, our offer of £300,000 subject to survey, to purchase The Crown on behalf of the community, has been accepted.

Secondly, the long awaited government grant, The Community Ownership Fund (COF) has been launched and SOC are, with your participation, going to make a bid. The government are offering grants (not loans) of up to £250,000 matched funding per successful applicant. Our target is to raise £180,000 with share purchases with a view to successfully bidding for an extra £180,000 in order to purchase The Crown & cover costs. The Fund has been set up to assist assets and amenities of community benefit, that would otherwise be at risk of being lost. Purchasing The Crown as a community pub & the last pub in the village of Fivehead, fulfills the COF criteria perfectly. However, the 1st bids must be submitted in early August, so we need to get our skates on!

To this aim, we are contacting all of you who expressed an interest in purchasing shares and asking you to transfer funds now. We have already had overwhelming support from you all and, as the PUBOMETER on the door of The Old School Rooms, shows, we have already received in the SOC bank account the magnificent sum of**£72.500**

On Friday 13th August at 5pm we are organising a 'pop up pub' & 'meet the team' fundraising event at the Village Hall/ Playing Field. We look forward to meeting you all then. Save the date, details to follow!

For those of you who are new to SOC, here are a few details. As the name suggests – Save Our Crown, is a community group set up to purchase The Crown as a community project, to ensure that we continue to have our pub in Fivehead. The Parish Council registered The Crown as an Asset of Community Value (ACV), which is in place for 5 years. SOC is now incorporated as A Community Benefit Society (CBS) & FCA approved, with a business bank account.

The proposal is to continue providing a venue for all the activities that the pub has been successfully offering over many years – for example: skittles, darts, Drama Society, Golf Society etc. The questionnaire that we carried out last year, asking you, the residents of Fivehead and the surrounding villages, showed very strongly that you believe that having a pub in the village is vital to village life. Save Our Crown will aim to provide the facilities that you mentioned in the survey, like real ales, good food, clubs and societies, facilities for walkers and cyclists, theme nights, live music. This will be The Community Village Pub and your input & views are vital to the success of the venture.

Scott's Spot – August 2021 Sabbatical

If it wasn't for the 'to do' list on my desk, I would be almost 'Demob happy'. As I write I am shortly to begin a sabbatical for the months of August, September and October, something that's been in the planning for well over three years. Like so much of recent life, Covid meant that the original plans for last year were cancelled, but with the situation now gradually easing it felt appropriate to have another try.

Why take a Sabbatical? Well because at one time Clergy used to work at a pace that allowed time for reflection and study as part of their normal ministry. Increased demands and heavier workloads have made this difficult to do. To take a block of leave therefore allows a minister time to read, reflect, plan and rest in a way that brings re-creation and enrichment to their ministry.

What is a sabbatical? Well it's not a holiday, although it should include a period of holiday or relaxation, nor is a sabbatical 'study leave' in the strict sense because it should have a dimension of recreation, rather than simply swapping one frenetic lifestyle for another. Nor does it necessarily have to be related to your current work: it offers the chance to more fully explore interests for which time is usually unavailable, and it does not have to be justified by being a proven benefit to what you are doing now or in the future. But the re-creation and enrichment of the time should ultimately benefit the people I work with, and for, when I return to parish life.

What are my plans? Unfortunately the family trip to Zimbabwe to contribute to care and conservation at an elephant and rhino sanctuary has not been possible (red lists and all that), and we've postponed until next year. Plenty else however is planned. Alongside a (less adventurous) family holiday to the Lake District, I shall be trying to develop a potentially commercial Christmas project that involves both woodwork and theology (ask me about it sometime!); I hope to spend time on retreat in prayer, reading and reflection; released from weekend responsibilities I hope to do some UK travelling to re-establish friendships from my musician, RAF, Theological College and Curacy days; and as a Dad and husband whose time (and head-space) is often limited by the pressures of the role and the cares and concerns of others, I'm looking forward to simply being around and available more than usual, and to enable Rowan time and space for similar refreshment herself. Beyond all this I'm hoping some tennis lessons and extra practice will help improve my backhand and the consistency of my serve! Anyone up for a game?

Time out for the above is a tremendous gift and I am grateful to the Bath and Wells Diocese for the opportunity. I am also enormously grateful to Revd. Stafford Low who will be the 'go to man' in my absence, and also to the faithful and brave individuals who have offered themselves in leadership to maintain a full pattern of Sunday and mid-week worship across our Benefice until I return in November.

Fivehead Nature Watch

Dave Braddock

Hello I am Dave. I moved into Ganges Close at the beginning of December with Mary. After several months spent renovating and decorating the house, I decided it was time to venture outside and see what natural treasures are to be found around Fivehead. We are lucky to be surrounded by several nature reserves to explore but these are well protected and documented so I decided to see what is around in the unprotected areas. I have a bucket list of seeing a Fivehead Barn Owl and I have never seen a Dormouse.

I have been interested in Nature since I was six when I was given a pair of yellow plastic binoculars by an uncle, and we spent most days learning about the countryside. One of my first jobs was to look after the ferrets, all I can remember is their smell and the fact that they bite, regularly and always escaped. Moving on past the teenage years I spent 20 plus years volunteering for Conservation charities, mainly the RSPB and I spent the last few years before I moved to Fivehead as a volunteer warden for a heathland RSPB reserve in Hampshire.

I decided to start with surveying for bats. A mammal that has quite a bit of legal protection but one that is ignored, either by accident or deliberately during the planning and building process. Even removing a hedge can disorientate bats if they use the hedge as a type of Tom Tom to find their way to breeding or feeding areas. Bright lights or extra bright streetlights can also cause them problems, also removing of mature trees and branches and UPVC fascia and soffits removes roosting and breeding areas. I can do more about bats in the future but space here is limited this time.

I surveyed a small area North of Ganges Close, down the Close in the back gardens to the bottom of the Glendale site over several days between 8.30pm and 05.30am. The method used was recording bat calls so software can turn them into audible sounds and spectrograms as human ears cannot hear them.

Greater Horseshoe and Common Pipistrelle spectrograms are below.

Most bats have a distinct wave form and sound, but they do overlap each other with calls at times and some bats are either difficult or impossible to identify by spectrogram, some bats cannot be told apart even in the hand unless you are an expert bat worker.



The results were quite fascinating. I have recorded and identified 7 species, one of which, Barbastelle Bat is exceedingly rare, I recorded Greater Horseshoe Bat before the groundwork at Glendale was done and hopefully, they will return soon.

I am sure that I have also recorded another 4 species of bat, but I need a bit more work on them to confirm.

Much of the wildlife around Fivehead is under recorded and is at risk of being destroyed or lost before we know what is there. I am hoping to record and discover important species, sites, and buildings.

I am a great believer in Citizen Science and local community involvement. So, I have an ask of you. If you know of or seen anything interesting or know of interesting areas/buildings, make a note of when, where and directions, then drop me an email davebraddock349@gmail.com or tell a member of the Parish Council and they will be able to forward me the information and I can check it out.

We need to get these species and areas officially recorded. If we get the records, then we can get them put on an official database to help in the future. This will only work if we all try to send in records to help keep Fivehead a special place for Nature.

I hope to do an article for the newsletter for each edition to let you know what I or some of you have found or seen.



Chicken with sauteed Apple slices

Ingredients

4 Chicken Breasts	1 Tbsp. Fresh Tarragon or 1 tsp dried
1 Tbsp. Cooking Oil (not olive)	2 eating apples
100g (4oz) Shallots very finely chopped	50g (2 oz) butter
Salt & freshly ground black pepper	2 tsp arrowroot
1 Tbsp Cider Vinegar	1 – 2 Tbsp water
250ml (8fl oz)Freshly pressed apple juice	

Method

Fry the chicken breasts gently in the oil until they are golden on both sides. Add the shallots and cook for another 2-3 minutes.

Season generously and pour on the cider vinegar. Allow that to bubble almost dry then add the apple juice. Turn the heat to low, add the tarragon, cover the pan and allow to simmer for 20 minutes until the chicken breasts are cooked through.

Meanwhile core the apples (don't peel them) and divide into 12 sections per apple.

In a separate pan, heat the butter until it foams, add the apples and over a medium heat turn until they are golden but not breaking up.

To serve, transfer the chicken pieces to a serving dish. Blend the arrowroot and water then stir into the sauce. Stir over a medium heat for about 2 minutes until the sauce thickens and clears. Pour the sauce over or around the chicken.

Mashed potatoes and courgettes go well with this dish.
